

100th Anniversary of Camp Logan Mutiny, 1917 - 2017

SAVE THE DATES *To commemorate and learn about* *this tragedy in Houston's history*

In August, 1917, gunfire erupted near downtown Houston. Fifteen Anglo civilians and police officers, and four Buffalo Soldiers from the U.S. Army's 3rd Battalion, 24th Infantry, died. This little-known tragedy in Houston's past will have its 100th anniversary in August. Efforts are underway to raise awareness about that violent night and explore what still may be learned from it.
